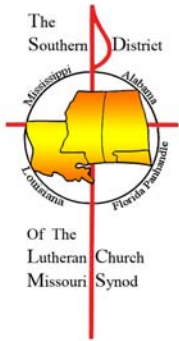

"GOD'S AMAZING MERCY"

But God who is rich in mercy, out of the great love in which He loved us even when we were dead through our trespasses made us alive together with Christ.

Ephesians

2:4-5

St. Paul describes our past lives before we knew Christ in very stark and discouraging terms. Without Christ we were dead through our trespasses, we lived in our passions of our flesh and followed the desires of body and mind. By nature, he says, we were children of wrath. But surprisingly, Paul replaces and overwhelms this bleak description in an astounding announcement: "But God, who is rich in mercy, out of his great love... has made us alive together with Christ... and raised us up with Him and made us sit with Him in the heavenly places."

No matter who we have been or what we have done, no matter how badly we may feel or others may feel about us, we have the assurance that "But God" has been written over our past lives. Have we wasted years of our lives by habits of which we are now ashamed? Are we guilty of having wronged people, even family and friends, in ways that we never thought we were capable of doing? Have we regrets or sorrows? There is an answer--- BUT GOD...

If we continue to feel guilty we need to step back from our past, from our preoccupation with our wrongs and passions, until we can see them framed by God's amazing mercy; until our perspective again includes God's great promises of forgiveness and restoration; until once more we can see the cross of Christ "towering o'er the wrecks of time." Then we will be assured again that God's grace is greater than all our sin.

Any guilt or condemnation presently in our lives can be swallowed up once we are willing to let go of it, and throw ourselves upon the overcoming mercy of God. If we have confessed our sins and have received God's forgiveness, then "But God..." covers the past and paves the way for the future. How thankful we can be that we have a Savior who truly sets us free.

Oh God, whose glory it is to always have mercy, be gracious to all who have gone astray from your ways and bring them again with penitent hearts and steadfast faith to embrace and hold fast the unchangeable truth of Your Word. Amen.

SO DIST DELTO VICAR MAKES TV COMMERCIAL

DELTO Vicar Dr. Ed Rosser, by chance, met someone involved in local network television programming. As a result of their meeting, Vicar Rosser was given the opportunity to produce, free of charge, a television commercial for **Solid Rock Lutheran Church – Argo, AL**. The format is one of an interview in which Vicar Rosser begins with a short historical background of Lutheranism noting the story of Martin Luther and the 99 Thesis. Bullet points include STAY WITH THE FOCUS. Vicar Rosser explains how sermons are based on Biblical texts which are predetermined for the entire year. Photos of congregational members *Sharing The Peace* are shown. Another bullet point is RECEIVE THE BLESSINGS with an explanation of how Lutherans celebrate Holy Communion. Vicar Rosser ends the two minute commercial indicating that CHRIST IS THE FOCUS; it's all about the cross and the gift of God's sacrifice for each of us. "My grace is sufficient for you." Now, was this a chance meeting with the television representative? What do you think?

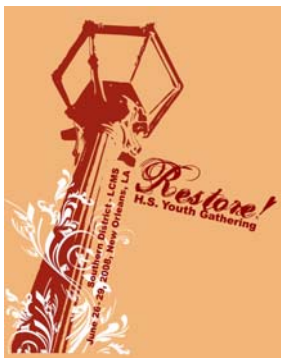
