THE STEADFASTNESS OF THE LORD

We wonder at Jacob's working seven years for Rachel's hand in marriage, and then seven more years because Laben tricked him. In most cases that solution would be unacceptable today. He had an anchor to steady him, a stability to rely on, and a rock on which to stand as the winds of circumstance and injustice buffeted him. He had a covenant with God. "He is mindful of his covenant for ever, of the word that he commanded for a thousand generations" (Ps 105:8). He could find stability in his God and the eternal covenant that was between them.

As Christians, we too have the promise of stability, a covenant, an everlasting kingdom that is secure and timeless. The Parable of the Mustard Seed that grows into a great tree and provides shelter and security for the birds of the air is a picture of that kingdom. Paul in the eighth chapter of Romans describes God's love for us, a love so secure that it will stand fast in all things throughout eternity. It is the sure foundation for us in this here-today-and-gone-tomorrow world.

Don't take the new covenant for granted. Don't minimize the kingdom's importance. Know that it's acquisitions have come at a price.

We pray: Bless, Lord, all who seek the steadfastness of your kingdom in this chaotic and stressful world. And give us the faith, that we have it as our own. Amen.

New Season of Partnership Through Transforming Churches Network (TCN)

Seasons of Discovery is a step-wise church transformation process delivered in four seasons over two or more years that helps congregations to begin engaging their community with the Gospel of Jesus.

What will your congregation (pastor & leaders) discover?

- People in your community who are looking for hope (<u>1 Tim. 6:17</u>)
- Good works that God has prepared in advance for us to do in the community (<u>Eph.2:10</u>)
- People within the congregation who have a passion for reaching the lost (Rom. 1:16)

More discoveries:

- God's unique vision for your church (<u>1 Tim. 2:4</u>)
- Joy and excitement from living out that vision in your community (Phil. 4:4)
- The 8 Hinge Factors that open doors to your community (John 10:9)

Each season includes:

- Personal coaching, skill builders & learning guides for the pastor
- Tools for equipping people for ministry
- · Sermons & Bible Studies to rally the people of the church around the theme of the season
- · Outreach activities

Seasons of Discovery to view a video with the details as presented by TCN executive director, Rev. Dr. Terry Tieman. There is also a PowerPoint presentation along with a brochure and discovery map. Southern District congregations can enroll to begin the process in January 2015. Southern District's partnership with TCN makes the Season of Discovery process available at a reduced price. The usual cost is \$1,800/season but for the Southern District it is \$1,200/season, with a special price of \$900/season for the first six congregations enrolling in the process. Seasons of Discovery calls for a congregation's investment in the process to make sure the follow-through is achieved. Too often, planning is done at the congregational level but little it ever done to implement the plans.

On June 22nd, in their morning worship service, The Lutheran Church of Vestavia Hills (Birmingham) celebrated the ministry of Southern District President Kurtis D. Schultz. Rev. Michael Ahlemeyer of LCV presided over the service in which former Synodical President Rev. Dr. Gerald B. Kieschnick preached. Mrs. Becky Schultz and Mrs. Terry Kieschnick were present.

Rev. David A Doroh, Second Vice-President of the Southern District, on behalf of the Board of Directors indicated to Pres. Schultz that a gift in his honor was given to his high school, Walther Christian Academy in Melrose Park, IL.

Mr. Scott Mooney, President of the congregation, on behalf of the congregation indicated to Mrs.

Becky Schultz that a gift in her honor was given Lutheran Music Program - home of the Lutheran Summer Music Academy and Festival. Mrs. Schultz is a member of their Board of Directors. She is an accomplished musician of piano, organ and is learning the cello.

In his sermon Rev. Kieschnick pointed out the commitment shown by President Schultz to the LCMS Council of Presidents.
