THIS MINISTRY THAT WE SHARE

THE GOOD FIGHT

"Fight the good fight of faith; take hold of the eternal life to which you were called." (1 Timothy 6:12)

In these words that Paul wrote to his beloved Timothy, who had oversight for the church in Ephesus, he reminds him that he is in a spiritual battle. Timothy was surrounded by men who were teaching false doctrine; men who "were depraved in mind and bereft of truth." It was a society in which many people ruled by a desire for riches, a particular temptation for the new converts to Christ. Paul urged Timothy to remember that his call was to have a militant zeal for God's cause; to "aim at righteousness, godliness, faith, love, steadfastness, gentleness.


Those of us today, who take our Christian life seriously, like Timothy, are called to "fight the good fight of faith." Often, however, the problem arises that our fight is not a good one because we fight for ourselves rather than for Christ. When I reflect back upon my own life I see that I expended a great deal of energy and time to have my own way; to hold onto my opinions and defend my rightness. Part of the fight of faith in my life is to hear and accept the truth spoken to me by others, who are helping me to come into greater freedom and a deeper faith in Christ.


When we fight for the wrong thing or to stay in control of our lives, ultimately we come to see that our fight is against God. Paul's conversion experience on the Damascus Road is the classic example of this. When the blinding moment of self-revelation came, he heard the voice of Jesus say, "Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me?" (Acts 9:14) From that moment on Paul took up the good fight of the faith. His life was turned around and he became a creative channel for the Holy Spirit and the greatest missionary in the history of the church.

Paul's words to Timothy have challenged and encouraged Christians in every age. John S.B. Monsell was inspired to write: "Fight the good fight with all your might; Christ is your strength, Christ thy right, lay hold on life and it shall be thy joy and crown eternally."

called us to stand in the midst of the alien forces of our time and proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ, help us to be aware of these temptations which weaken our witness for Him and grant to us the courage we need to fight "the good fight of the faith." Amen.

ROSA YOUNG, A LUTHERAN LEGEND



Every year the Southern District honors Rosa Young and her work at the Rosebud Memorial. The Memorial is usually held in late September at the original school site in Rosebud at Christ Lutheran Church.

Rosa Young, born in 1874, in Rosebud, AL, graduated from Payne University – Selma in 1909. She was 19 and class valedictorian. In her speech, she stressed the obligation of service: "He that is greatest among you shall be your servant,' is the language of the Great Teacher. To serve is regarded as a divine privilege as well as a duty by every right-minded man."

After several years as a teacher, Rosa opened a private school with seven black students. In three terms, it had grown to 215 students. In her effort to get funding, she wrote to the famed African-American educator Booker T. Washington of Tuskegee Institute. He advised her to

write to the Board of Colored Missions of the Lutheran Church. He liked them because of the religious training which they were giving the "colored people."

Thanks to the Lutherans and Rosa's own unflagging efforts, thirty rural schools were established. Rosa also founded a high school and a junior college in Selma (the Alabama Lutheran Academy) on whose faculty she served. Its purpose was to prepare young women to teach in Christian day schools. Rosa worked tirelessly most of her 96 years. She died in 1970.

The annual celebration of The Rosa J. Young Memorial is September 22nd; activities begin at 9:30am. The **Rev. Frank T. Marshall** (emeritus) from **St. Paul Lutheran** in **Jacksonville**, **FL**, will be the speaker for the worship services. The chairman of the Memorial Committee, Rev. James Wiggins, Sr. writes: "Rev. Marshall brings with him some 40 years in the Mission Field." The theme of this celebration is the 2013 Synod's Convention theme: "Baptized For This Moment."

A FOND AUF WIEDERSEHEN AND A HEARTY DANKE

Rev. David Alan Lewis attended his last So. Dist. Board of Directors meeting on September 20th. Dave accepted a call to **St. Trinity Lutheran** congregation in **St. Louis**. Dave and his wife, Heidi, and their daughter, Skylar Joy, will be traveling mid-October to the place of his birth.

Dave's ministry roots are deep in the So. Dist. He vicared at **Atonement** in **Metairie**, **Louisiana**. He returned as an ordained minister to the state of Alabama. **St. Paul's** in **Decatur**, **AL**, became his home for eighteen years. He served St. Paul's as Assistant Pastor, Associate Pastor and Sole Pastor.

Dave sought a new challenge but never in his wildest dreams did he think his new challenge would be determined by the weather. In 2006, he was called by the Board of Directors as a Mission Developer in Northwest Mississippi-DeSoto County. As he was getting ready to travel north from Decatur, Hurricane Katrina came ashore in Southeast Louisiana and the levees broke. So Dave went south instead. He accepted, by default, the position of Disaster Relief Coordinator for an historic, once-in-a-lifetime disaster. He pulled the District through for three years. Then he was on to Mississippi where he started the congregation CrossRoad church in Hernando and developed the congregation there for five years.

That's a total of 26 years of ministry in the Southern District!

The Southern District has been the beneficiary of Dave's service in a myriad of ways. He has.

- Served on the Local Volunteers Team, Servant Event Team twice, and Community Life Team on four National Youth Gatherings;
- Served as Planning Facilitator and Program Director for the Southern District Intergenerational Event – One-derful Water I and II; and, the Ablazing Grace Family Gathering;
- Served on the Southern District Board of Directors as a Member and as a Vice-President;
- Served as Circuit Youth Advisor; Youth Committee Member and Chair; Mission Committee Member; Personnel Committee Chair; and, he chaired the recent Ad Hoc Committee on Structure.



Support Needed for Senate Bill (S. 1164) on Church Health Plans

In the turmoil accompanying the passage of the Affordable Care Act (health care reform), the important role of church plans was overlooked.

Beginning in 2014, government subsidies will be made available to eligible individuals who purchase their health coverage from government health care exchanges; however the subsidies will not be available to those who get their health care from church health plans (e.g., the Concordia Health Plan).

Please write your United States Senators (contact information at senate.gov) urging them to support a new bill which will allow workers enrolled in church health plans to receive the same subsidies as other individuals. President's View of Direction for District Stewardship

Don Hennings, Stewardship Committee Chairman and a committee member met with President Schultz in mid-August 2013 to discuss the direction for district stewardship given changes in organization and staffing.

Summary Statements from President Schultz' Discussion on Stewardship—Stewardship Southern Style focuses on Making Disciples for Jesus. To that end, President Schultz and the Stewardship



Testimony + Time + Talent + Treasure

Committee are of a single mind that all we do (strategic, operational, and tactical stewardship) requires <u>close relationships</u>, <u>clear communications</u>, and <u>loving trust</u> among partners at all levels.

Strategically, President Schultz endorses the current stewardship committee structure and the Four T's approach (Testimony, Time, Talent and Treasure) as means to achieve our District vision. He supports continued participation in Synod conferences and workshops and the intentional use of stewardship methods and materials from all sources.

Operationally, President Schultz considers the new Mission and Ministry Facilitator (MMF) the key player in resourcing and communicating District stewardship. He expects the committee to increase its current proactive role and continue initiatives that improve networking and close relationships with congregations. Specifically, President Schultz requested greater clarity of the role of the Circuit Stewardship Advocates' approach to communicate with congregations and connect with people.

Tactically, President Schultz reviewed the information reports and services currently provided to the committee and he endorses continued Committee support by the District staff. It is critically important during the current transition to the MMF that everyone involved provide the committee regular reminders, examples, and best practices. He also asked that we consider ways to use easily developed on line forms to expedite processing time and improve accuracy.

Walking together with Synod, we have defined stewardship in this manner: Christian stewardship is the free and joyous activity of the child of God and God's family, the church, in managing all of life and life's resources for God's purposes.

To this end, stewardship is discipleship. We request your prayerful consideration and generous response to the 2014 Partnership Commitment. May we – by Jesus' love and the Holy Spirit's power – respond by managing all of God's gifts to the glory of Jesus (Waldo Werning).



TCN provides resources and processes to assist congregations to renew and to strengthen relationships in their communities through sharing Jesus. Efforts are made to provide options and choices to congregations to bring focus to the overall mission and ministry. TCN continues to broker new resources. TCN now offers a two-year process broken into four seasons. The seasons focus on Preparation, Visioning, Outreach, and Empowerment. Go to www.tcnprocess.com and click on "Seasons of Discovery" to learn more abut this new process.

Outreach and discipleship need not be a complicated process. It is really about being intentional with a heart and mission for touching lives with the Gospel. TCN is a partner to help pastors develop skills in outreach and leadership. What accountability for Kingdom growth is in place through your congregation? TCN offers pastor's learning communities, consultation weekends, coaching support along with a church assessment survey. The survey provides insight into the eight hinge factors identified through TCN research. The survey is an excellent tool as a congregation dedicates itself to a new life cycle.
