Hurricane Michael

The Lord placed Trinity Lutheran Church in the heart of the disaster area and this brought the mission field to them. Pastor Paul McComack and the members of Trinity were blessed with two opportunities of service: Trinity's food bank and the Lutheran Early Response Teams' (LERT) chainsaw efforts.

Five days after the October 10th landfall of Hurricane Michael, Trinity began a food bank to serve the people of Panama City and the surrounding areas. Trinity gave out food, tents, bought shoes for children, but most importantly gave hugs. Even though people were sad, they knew we were there to help them any way that we could. We began with donations from Lutheran churches locally, then from all over the country.

The food bank does far more than just give out food. Volunteers from Trinity take food, blankets, grills, and charcoal to displaced families living in tent cities. The children whose lives have been so disrupted, who now live in a tent, receive books, games, coloring books, and crayons. The love of

Christ can be seen in the hope which sparkles in the eyes of these children. Trinity volunteers also work with the newly combined schools to hand out bookbags, school supplies, snacks, and personal care products.

The Lutheran Early Response Teams (LERT) have been active since early in the recovery as well. Teams have come to Panama City from over half a dozen states to show the love of Christ by offering free tree and debris removal at the homes of Lutheran families and community members. LERT volunteers have worked at all three LCMS churches in Panama City and one in Mexico Beach.




THE FACILITY:
